

COMMUNIQUE

E-OBJECTION

The Public is hereby informed that, following amendments brought to the MRA Act 2004 by the Finance Act 2015, the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) has introduced the E-Objection facility with effect from 01st July 2015. The E-Objection permits the lodging of an objection electronically through the MRA's Website: **www.mra.mu**.

This applies to objections against assessments/ claims raised under the Income Tax Act, the VAT Act, the Environment Protection Act, the Gambling Regulatory Authority Act, the Customs Act, Excise Act and the Customs Tariff Act.

The 10% down payment on objection, where applicable, may also be paid electronically as from 1st July 2015.
