Classification of food supplements of Chapter 21 and medicaments of Chapter 30.

Food supplements also called dietary supplements are put up in measured doses such as capsules, pills, tablets, etc.

These manufactured products are intended to supplement a person's normal diet and generally contain nutrients, sweeteners, stabilisers, flavours, extracts or other substances with indications that they are intended to boost immunity, improve resistance and to maintain general health or well-being.

On the other hand, products of Chapter 30 are products being medicaments designed specifically for prophylactic or therapeutic uses for the treatment of particular diseases, disorders, ailments or other medical conditions. They are often presented in the form of capsules, pills, intravenous injections, prefilled syringes, tablets, etc.

Therefore, food supplements, put up in measured doses, are classifiable in Heading 21.06 and medicaments designed specifically for prophylactic or therapeutic uses and put up in measured doses, or in forms or packings for retail sale, are classified in Heading 30.04.
