

## MRA seizes a variety of IPR-infringing goods

The Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) seized a variety of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)-infringing goods at the Customs Freight Station in the Port Area on 12 November 2025. The consignment, comprising 113 packages, originated from Tanjong Pelepas, Malaysia.



Following a risk-profiling exercise, the consignment was selected for a 100% examination by the Brigades des Marchandises Unit (BDM). The inspection revealed the following counterfeit / IPR-infringing items:

- Tommy Hilfiger – 74 pieces
- Louis Vuitton – 35 pieces
- Polo Ralph Lauren – 25 pieces
- Prada – 13 pieces
- Hermès – 11 pieces
- Burberry – 48 pieces
- Lacoste – 110 pieces
- Hugo Boss – 1,904 pieces



The case has been referred to the respective trademark right-holders. Such cases may be settled through an agreement between the parties involved, failing which legal action may be lodged before the competent Court against the infringer. In most instances, the goods are destroyed by the MRA, in the presence of representatives of the right-holders, following a Court judgment.
