

MRA AND TADAT SECRETARIAT CO-HOST REGIONAL WORKSHOP IN MAURITUS

The Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) in collaboration with the TADAT Secretariat launched the Regional Tax Administration Diagnostic Assessment Tool (TADAT) Workshop on 8 September 2025 at the Integrated Customs Clearance Centre (ICCC), Plaine Magnien.



Spanning from 8 to 12 September 2025 under the theme: **Beyond 10 Years of TADAT Assessment: Building Stronger Tax Systems for Tomorrow with Field Guide 2025**, the workshop, brings together tax professionals from 22 African countries in view of enhancing tax administration through the TADAT framework.

In his keynote address, the Honourable Dhaneshwar Damry, Junior Minister, Ministry of Finance, emphasized the government's commitment to promote fiscal transparency and build resilient tax systems that support economic growth and inclusive development.
