

SPOOFED EMAILS

The **Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA)** draws the attention of the public that spoofed emails, purporting to emanate from the MRA, are currently being circulated.

The MRA hereby informs members of the public that it has not issued any such aforementioned emails. These emails are fake and do not originate from the MRA. Members of the public are strongly advised not to open any attachment, not to click on any link, not to reply to the email, and not to disclose any personal, banking or tax-related information.

Taxpayers are reminded to access MRA e-Services only through the official MRA website: www.mra.mu

The MRA is endeavouring to raise public awareness on the risks associated with such scams by providing, on its website, information on those scams.

The MRA brings to the attention of the public that it cannot be held responsible if its name and contact details are misused in messages intended to defraud members of the public. Should members of the public feel that they have been scammed, the MRA strongly recommends that they report the matter to the Police.

The public is also encouraged to bring to MRA's attention any such information and suspect communication.
