

T-shirt – short- sleeved casual top, usually of knitted cotton and having the form of a $m{T}$ when spread out – (The concise Oxford Dictionary Ninth Edition)

T-shirts classified in heading 61.09 means <u>lightweight knitted</u> or <u>crocheted</u> garments of the <u>vest-type</u>, of cotton or man-made fibers, not napped nor of pile or terry fabric.

Such T-shirt may: -

- be with or without pockets;
- be with long or short <u>close-fitting</u> sleeves;
- have a close-fitting or lower neckline (round, square, boat-shaped or v-shaped)
- have decorations in the form of advertising, pictures or an inscription in words, obtained by printing, knitting or other process.



However the T-shirt must not have:-

buttons or other fastenings;



- collar
- opening in the neckline;
- lace decoration;
- drawstring, ribbed waistband or other means of tightening at the bottom of the garment.
- a partial front opening at the neckline, fastened or merely overlapping or not overlapping at all.

The bottom of these garments is normally hemmed.

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
